TO THE MEMBERS OF DCM FINANCE AND LEASING LIMITED

Report on the audit of Standalone Ind AS Financial Statements

We have audited the accompanying standalone Ind AS financial statements of DCM FINANCE AND LEASING LIMITED ("the Company"), which comprise the Balance Sheet as at 31st March, 2018, the Statement of Profit and Loss, the Statement of Changes in Equity and the Statement of Cash Flows for the year then ended, and significant accounting policies and other explanatory information (hereinafter referred to as "Standalone Ind AS Financial Statements").

Risk management framework

The Company's board of directors has overall responsibility for the establishment and oversight of the Company's risk management which includes to identify, analyze and moniter the risks faced by the Company.

(i) Credit risk

Credit risk is the risk of financial loss to the Company if a customer or counterparty to a financial instrument fails to meet its contractual obligations, and arises principally from the Company's receivables from customers. Credit risk on cash and cash equivalents and bank balance other than cash and cash equivalent as mentioned above is limited as the Company generally invests in deposits with banks with high credit ratings assigned by domestic credit rating agencies.

(ii) Liquidity risk

Liquidity risk is the risk that the Company will encounter difficulty in meeting the obligations associated with its financial liabilities that are settled by delivering cash or another financial asset. The Company's approach to managing liquidity is to ensure, as far as possible, that it will have sufficient liquidity to meet its liabilities when they are fallen due, under both normal and stressed conditions, without incurring unacceptable losses or risking damage to the Company's reputation. The Company believes that its liquidity position, including total cash and cash equivalent and bank balances other than cash and cash equivalent of Rs. 11,60,697/ as at 31st March, 2018 (31st March, 2017 Rs.11,35,236/-, 1 April, 2016 Rs.11,10,809/-), anticipated future internally generated funds from operations will enable it to meet its future known obligations in the ordinary course of business.
